	Deliver Surgical Care	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Perform pre-operative assessment • Perform damage control surgery including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1) Insertion of thoracic drain • 2) Control of thoracic haemorrhages • 3) Perform tracheotomy • 4) Haemorrhage control (temporary haemostasis, limb vascular shunts etc.) • 5) Intestinal exclusion, bile and pancreatic drainage, drain for pancreatic and/or hepatic secretion • 6) Solid organ inspection and abdominal packing (liver, splenic, retroperitoneal and pelvic haemorrhage), splenectomy, nephrectomy. • Laparostomy • Perform abdominal revision surgery e.
